Skin and Coat

Fleas are still active even in winter. Fleas cause skin irritation and can distress pets and owners. Total flea control means treating your pet and the household. There are many spot-on products available that give excellent flea protection for your pet and [SAMPLE] house. Some of [SAMPLE] products also come as an effective long-lasting spray for flea control. Nails

Your pet's nails have been clipped today. They should be checked again in 3 months either by [SAMPLE] vet or at our Nurse Clinic to decide if [SAMPLE] re-clip is needed.

Eyes

Normal Eyes - Your pet's eyes are bright and clear, and normal vision is apparent. There is no evidence of discharge, swelling, or irritation. [SAMPLE] pupils are normal and responsive, and [SAMPLE] blink and menace reflexes are present. There are no visible signs of cataracts, ageing changes to [SAMPLE] lens, or retinal disease. [SAMPLE] pupil is normally responsive and [SAMPLE] membranes around [SAMPLE] eye are not inflamed.

Ears

No action needed with ears.

Cough

Normal Respiratory Examination - No coughing, gagging or tracheal irritation. Lungs sound fine, and there is no wheezing or abnormal lung sounds.

Teeth and Mouth

Cleaning 1-2 times daily with CET. Toothpaste will keep your pet's teeth healthy. If you cannot brush your pet's teeth, Logic oral hygiene gel can be placed in [SAMPLE] mouth or on food. Its action cleans [SAMPLE] teeth with no need to brush. Hill's have produced TD diet which has special bite sized chunks to clean teeth as your pet enjoys a meal.

Cardiac

Normal Heart Examination - No abnormal heart sounds or irregular heart beats were found. [SAMPLE] pulse has normal character and rate.

Musculoskeletal

The musculoskeletal system includes the bones, joints, ligaments, tendons, and muscles that work together to make your pet move.

Normal - At this time, your pet has no history of lameness or limping.

Identification

Worming Advice

Pets under 6 months old need worming every month. Adult dogs and cats should be wormed every 3 months. Neutering Advice

Having your dog castrated has benefits both for you and your dog. Castrated dogs are less aggressive, more easily trained, and are less likely to urine mark their territory. They are infertile and do not wander off in search of bitches. The benefits for your dog are that he is far less likely to be involved in a road accident, will not get prostatic tumours, peri-anal adenomata or develop perineal hernias. Dogs will only put on weight after castration if they are overfed and/or under exercised.
